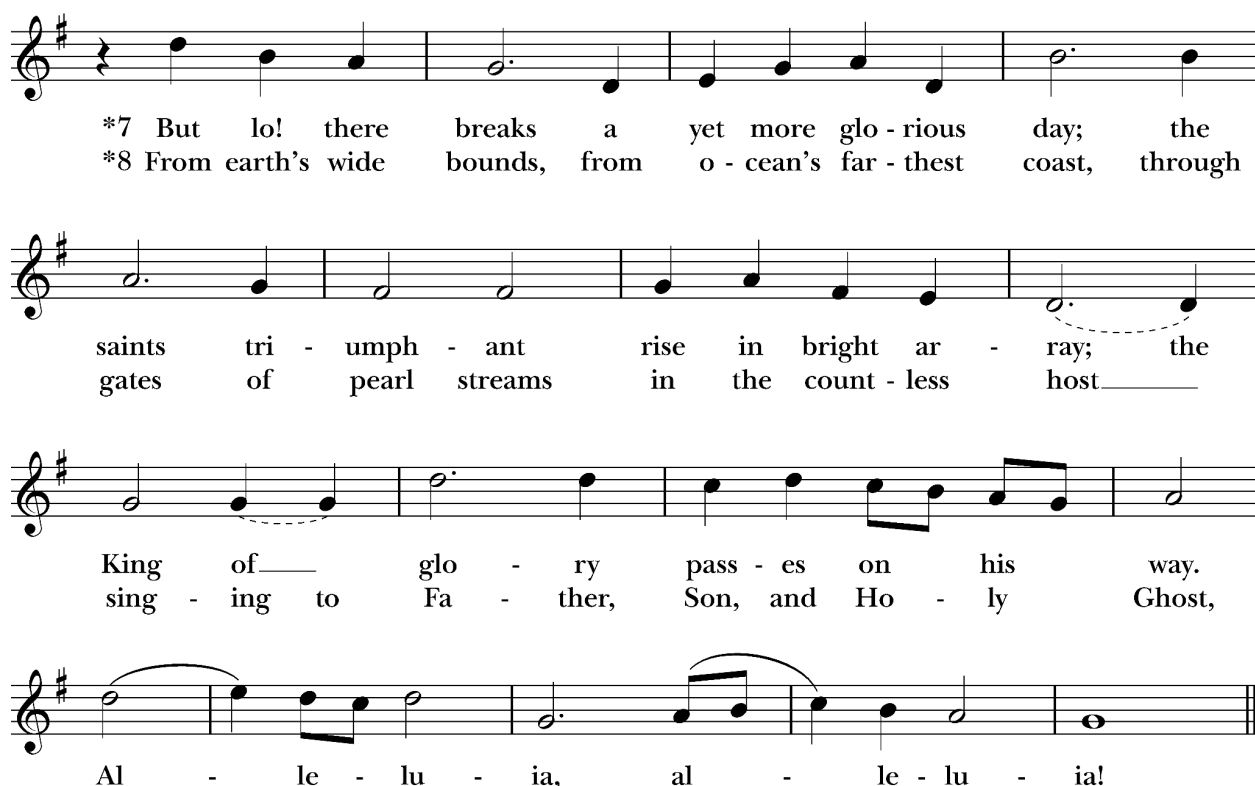

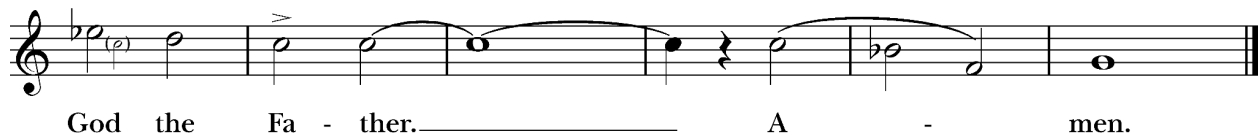

Daniel 7:1-3, 15-18

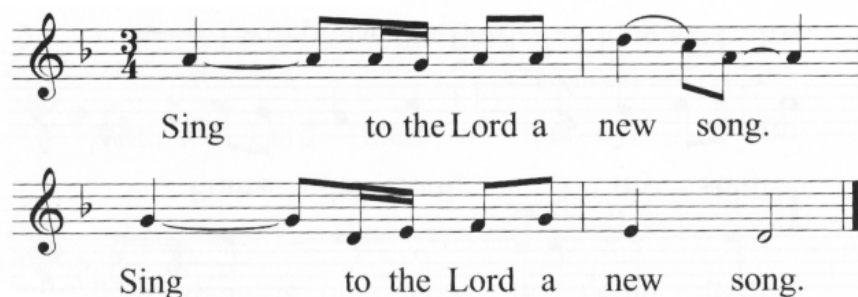

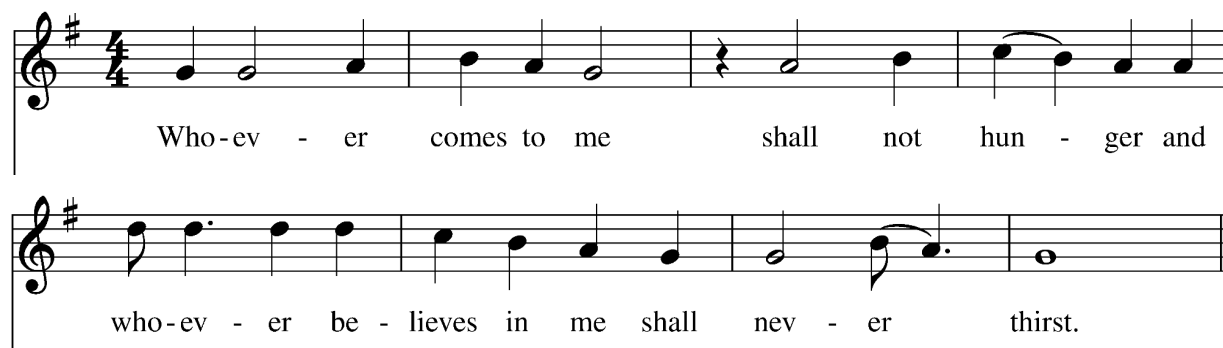

### **Vestry Update from October 21, 2025, Meeting**

- **Tell Out My Soul** Season of Stewardship concludes on November 9 with an ingathering of pledges and promises of time, wisdom, talent, and financial investments in Trinity. Parishioners are sharing their stories as living epistles and written testimonials every week.
- **Sabbatical Collect** Vestry composed a collect (prayer) for the congregation to use in congregational and personal prayer before, during, and after Rev. Sabeth's sabbatical:

My spirituality has been grounded in the Episcopal tradition but enriched by contemplative, social justice, charismatic, and nature-centered expressions.
