Whether you are joining us in person or livestream, we are so glad you are here to worship with us on this holy day.




READING FROM HEBREW SCRIPTURE

Isaiah 11:1-10

A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots. The spirit of the Lord shall rest on him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord. His delight shall be in the fear of the Lord. 

GOSPEL READING

Matthew 3:1-12

The Holy Gospel of our Savior Jesus Christ according to Matthew.

Glory to you, Lord Christ.

In those days John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness of Judea, proclaiming, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." This is the one of whom the prophet Isaiah spoke when he said, "The voice of one crying out in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight." Now John wore clothing of camel's hair with a leather belt around his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. Then the people of Jerusalem and all Judea were going out to him, and all the region along the Jordan, and they were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. But when he saw many Pharisees and Sadducees coming for baptism, he said to them, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Bear fruit worthy of repentance. Do not presume to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our ancestor'; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. Even now the ax is lying at the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire.

"I baptize you with water for repentance, but one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to carry his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing floor and will gather his wheat into the granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

I served much of my priesthood in the mountains of Colorado, where I was born and raised, including 16 years as Rector of St. Mark's in Durango. Later, I served as a professional Interim priest in 7 different congregations, moving every year and a half or so. In 2019, I was called to serve as Interim at St. James' Episcopal Church in Florence, Italy, and then retired to Tacoma 5 years ago. My wife Terri and I live in a multi-generational home with my daughter, son-in-law, and 5-year-old grandson. I love to sing in choirs, walk, bike, ski, woodwork, cook Italian food, and play my trombone in Tacomarama Community Street (Honk) Band. My spirituality has been grounded in the Episcopal tradition but enriched by contemplative, social justice, charismatic, and nature-centered expressions. I'm currently planning a pilgrimage walk from Stonehenge to Canturbury in late Spring.

He is committed to using de-escalation and gentle redirection to support individuals who may be struggling or disruptive, helping them in a way that respects their dignity while also caring for the needs of our parish community. Sonny may appear intimidating at first, but he is in fact a deeply understanding and patient Christian man. He has a genuine heart for

serving others and is committed to showing compassion to all. Sonny does his best to support our less fortunate and mentally struggling community members, offering kindness, patience, and guidance whenever he can.

- IN PERSON: The church office is closed the week between Christmas and New Year's. Any contributions that you would like to make in-person should be brought with you to church and placed in the offering plate on or before Sunday morning, December 28.
